The new McClintock park is great. Could a 4th of July fireworks show originate there?

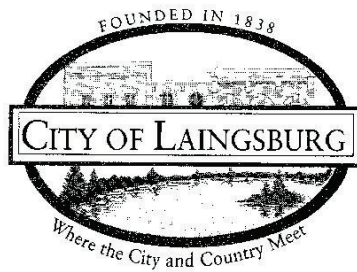

Moved by Bayer, seconded by Rhodabeck to approve the minutes of January 21, 2009. Motion carried.

The planned Community Forum being held as part of the update to the five (5) year parks and recreation plan commenced by a review of the planning progress so far. Chapter 3- Parks and Recreation Administration, Chapter 4- Parks and Recreation Inventory and Chapter 5- Resource Inventory was reviewed as well as corresponding maps (Parks and Recreation Plan Inventory Map and Potential Non-motorized Route and Connections Map). Property recently acquired and planned for use as a Public Library was added, as City owned land was added to documentation.

The consultant reviewed with the committee the results from the parks and recreation survey of the public.

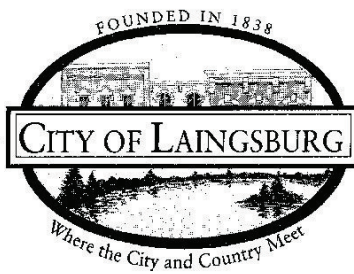

Mayor Culpepper called the meeting to order at 8:00 p.m. in the City Hall Council Chambers. Councilman Leonard led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Public comment – none.

95-09. Moved by Fredline, seconded by Rose to approve the minutes of August 3, 2009, as presented. Motion carried.

96-09. Moved by Fredline, seconded Rhodabeck by to approve the Treasurer's report, subject to audit. Motion carried.

97-09. Moved by Fredline, seconded by Bayer to open a public hearing on the 2009-2013 Parks and Recreation Plan. Motion carried.

The Mayor opened the floor to the audience for any comments on the proposed Parks and Recreation Plan. Lori Strom commented on the plans long and short term goals, her excitement of the use the new park is getting and wanted to compliment everyone for their hard work on the plan and all of the recent park and recreation improvements over the past few years.

98-09. Moved by Frank, seconded by Fredline to close the public hearing on the 2009 - 2013 Parks and Recreation Plan. Motion carried.

99-09. Resolved by Fredline, seconded by Rhodabeck

WHEREAS, the City of Laingsburg has undertaken a five-year Parks and Recreation Plan which describes the physical features, existing recreation facilities and the desired actions to be taken to improve and maintain recreation facilities during the period between 2009 and 2013, and

WHEREAS, a public comment session was held September 14, 2009, at the City Hall in the Council Chambers to provide an opportunity for citizens to express opinions, ask questions, and discuss all aspects of the Parks and Recreation Plan, and

WHEREAS, the City of Laingsburg has developed the plan for the benefit of the entire community and to adopt the plan as a document to assist in meeting the recreation needs of the community, and

WHEREAS after the public meeting, the City Council voted to adopt said Parks and Recreation Plan.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THE City of Laingsburg City Council hereby adopts the City of Laingsburg Parks and Recreation Plan as a guideline for improving recreation for the residents of the City of Laingsburg.

Resolution declared adopted.

- 100-09. Moved by. Frank seconded by Fredline to open a public hearing in regards to amendments to the City's Disabled Motor Vehicle ordinance. Motion carried.

A public hearing commenced to receive public input for the amendments to the Disabled Motor Vehicle ordinance. There was no comment from the audience. amendments to the City's Disabled Motor Vehicle ordinance by adding under Section 30-172. Defined. (a) *"A vehicle that is licensed through the State of Michigan as an off-road Recreation Vehicle ("ORV") shall also be deemed as a licensed vehicle. Such vehicles are subject to location requirements set forth below* And adding (d) *unless applicable under the preceding item, a vehicle licensed as an ORV shall not be stored in the front yard. The ORV shall be screened from view by an opaque fence so arranged as to keep such vehicles from view of persons on public streets or rights-of-way and from view by occupants of adjacent dwellings, i, any. Fences shall be in compliance with the provisions set forth in the City's Zoning Ordinance. For a vehicle licensed, as an ORV that exceeds the height of th maximum height of a fence, landscaping and/or other measures shall be implemented to meet the objective to keep from view as described above.*

- 101-09. Moved by Fredline, seconded by Bayer to close the public hearing in regards to the amendments to the City's Disabled Motor Vehicle ordinance. Motion carried.

- 102-09. Moved by Fredline, seconded by Rhodabeck grant approval of the petition for special land use and preliminary site plan submitted by Mike Wood & Son Asphalt, Inc., for property located in Section 29 of the City of Laingsburg and as legally described in the petition based on the following reasoning and subject to the following conditions:

Reasoning:

1. Standards set forth under Section 704 (basis for determination) appear to be met subject to the conditions set forth below.
2. Standards set forth under Section 604 (preliminary site plan requirements) and Section 606 (standards for review) has been or can be met subject to the conditions set forth below.

Conditions:

1. Address outstanding issues and provide informational requirements outlined in items 3, 4 and 5 of staff's report in the final site plan that is required prior to any additional use or improvement on the site. A final site plan must be approved within 60 days of special land use approval by City Council.
2. Junk, debris, and non-business affiliated vehicles must be removed from the site within 30 days of special land use approval by City Council.
3. The MDEQ permit that is assumed to be required due to the location of the proposed improvements within the 100 year floodplain must be acquired and in effect within 180 days of special land use approval by City Council.
4. If the above conditions are not met, all equipment and vehicles must be removed from the property and the operation of the business is to cease and desist immediately. In that the use of the property would be in violation of the ordinance, all appropriate legal remedies, including fine, penalty, and seeking of injunctive relief, should be pursued if conditions are not met.

All yes roll call vote. Motion carried unanimously.

- 103-09. Moved by Baycr, seconded by Fredline to grant permission for the Planning Commission to proceed to distribute copies of the proposed 2009-2010 Master Plan to adjacent communities: Victor and Sciota townships, as well as Clinton and Shiawassee Counties. Motion carried.

- 104-09. Moved by Rhodabeck, seconded by Fredline to continue a Uniform Video Service Local Franchise Agreement ("Agreement"), pursuant to 2006 PA 480, MCL 484 3301 *et seq.* (the "Act") by and between the City of Laingsburg MI, a

municipal corporation (the “Franchising Entity”), and Broadstripe, LLC, a State of Delaware corporation doing business as Broadstripe. The Franchise Fee in said Agreement is to continue to be three percent. All yes roll call vote. Motion carried.

- 105-09. Moved by Rose, seconded by Rhodabeck to re-appoint John Lancour to the Downtown Development Authority for a four-year term. Motion carried.
- 106-09. Moved by Leonard, seconded by Rhodabeck to award the apparent low bid for the Asbestos Abatement for the city properties located at 217 E. Grand River and 208 Irene Street to Asbestos Abatement, Inc. in the amount of \$4,930 and authorize treasurer to sign the contract. Motion carried.
- 107-09. Moved by Frank, seconded by Fredline to pay the bills in the amount of \$801,536.71, General Fund checks # 33189 – 33283. Also electronic payments of EFPTS \$4,883.41 – Federal Withholding, Social Security and Medicare for August. All yes roll call vote. Motion carried.
- 108-09. Moved by Fredline, seconded by Bayer to enter into an agreement with Kenmark, Inc. of Buckley, Michigan, to furnish and provide holiday decorations, display equipment and materials for the 2009 holiday season in the amount of \$1,375.00. The cost is to be divided equally between the City of Laingsburg, Downtown Development Authority and Laingsburg Business Association. All yes roll call vote. Motion carried.
- 109-09. Moved by Rhodabeck, seconded by Bayer to approve the Morton Salt Bulk Safe-T Salt Quotation at \$61.08 per ton delivered. All yes roll call vote. Motion carried.
- 110-09. Moved by Fredline, seconded by Rhodabeck to pay back LSW Emergency Services Authority for fire operations the following amount: \$10,323.66 over a period of five years. First year's installment \$2,323.66, second year – fifth year \$2,000 annually. This comes as a recommendation from the Finance Committee.



The following resolution was offered by Councilman Fredline and seconded by Councilman Rhodabeck:

WHEREAS, a public comment session was held September 14, 2009, at the City Hall in the Council Chambers to provide an opportunity for citizens to express opinions, ask questions, and discuss all aspects of the Parks and Recreation Plan, and

WHEREAS, the City of Laingsburg has developed the plan for the benefit of the entire community and to adopt the plan as a document to assist in meeting the recreation needs of the community, and

WHEREAS after the public meeting, the City Council voted to adopt said Parks and Recreation Plan.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THE City of Laingsburg City Council hereby adopts the City of Laingsburg Parks and Recreation Plan as a guideline for improving recreation for the residents of the City of Laingsburg.
