Lions Club Springtime Festival



Spring Clean-Up!

REMINDER FROM THE LAINGSBURG POLICE DEPARTMENT

It's time to do a little spring cleaning!

New nuisance ordinances have gone into effect regarding litter, trash, rubble, etc., as well as new requirements for storage of recreational vehicles. **All vehicles — including campers, trailers, boats, jet skis and ATVs — must be REGISTERED and OPERABLE!** Laingsburg Police will now start enforcement of these ordinances.

Brush and Yard Waste Pickup

Brush pickup will begin **the first week in May**. This service is offered to you free of charge as residents, so please be considerate of the following requirements when placing your brush at the curb for pickup:

- * Yard waste should be bagged up in compostable bags
- * All sticks and limbs should be piled up neatly in the same direction!
- * No tree limbs larger than 6 inches in diameter or 3 feet in length
- * No stumps, firewood, dirt, trash, vines or any foreign objects.
- * Thorn-bearing items must be put in a separate piles
- * Brush must be placed at the curbside or roadside, **but not in the street**
- * **Call city hall at 517-651-5374 and have your name placed on the pickup list.**

If you would like your brush picked up before May, please bag it up in a compostable bag and call City Hall to let us know when it's ready.
